About Verzenio

Verzenio is a prescription medicine used to treat a type of breast cancer in adults. It is a medicine:

- You can take if you have a type of breast cancer called HR+, HER2— (hormone receptor positive, human epidermal growth factor receptor 2 negative) and the cancer has spread to other parts of the body (metastasized)
- That is given with an aromatase inhibitor as initial endocrine-based therapy. If the
 cancer has gotten worse after hormone therapy, then Verzenio is given with fulvestrant.
 If the cancer has gotten worse after both hormone therapy and chemotherapy, then
 Verzenio is given by itself

It is not known if Verzenio is safe and effective in children.

What is Verzenio?

Verzenio is a targeted treatment known as a CDK4 & 6 inhibitor. Verzenio is not chemotherapy. Verzenio is a prescription medicine used to treat a type of breast cancer in adults. It is a medicine you can take if you have a type of breast cancer called HR+, HER2- and the cancer has spread to other parts of the body (metastasized).

How Verzenio is given

- with an aromatase inhibitor as initial endocrinebased therapy
- if the cancer has gotten worse after hormone therapy, then Verzenio is given with fulvestrant
- if the cancer has gotten worse after both hormone therapy and chemotherapy, then Verzenio is given by itself

It is not known if Verzenio is safe and effective in children.

CDK4 & 6=cyclin-dependent kinases 4 and 6. HER2=human epidermal growth factor receptor 2 negative. HR+=hormone receptor positive.

How Verzenio works

Verzenio targets breast cancer cells where they grow and divide

- Verzenio is in a class of drugs known as CDK4 & 6 inhibitors. CDK4 & 6 are proteins that control how fast cells grow and divide
- These proteins are found on both normal and cancer cells. They become overactive in metastatic breast cancer, causing cells to grow and divide uncontrollably. This leads to the spread of cancer
- Verzenio interrupts these proteins and cells just as they are deciding to grow and divide. It slows down cancer cell growth and division, causing cancer cells to become inactive or even die
- In preclinical studies, continuous exposure to Verzenio put the brakes on CDK4 & 6 proteins, which delayed cancer cells from growing and dividing

How is Verzenio different?

Verzenio is taken differently—it's the first and only CDK4 & 6 inhibitor that can be taken every day, twice a day*

Verzenio is a CDK4 & 6 inhibitor. It is the first and only oral tablet of its kind that can be taken every day for the treatment of HR+, HER2-metastatic breast cancer.

*150 mg or 200 mg orally twice a day, as directed by your doctor.

Try to establish a routine of taking your morning and evening doses at about the same time each day.

- Multiple tablet strengths (50 mg, 100 mg, 150 mg, and 200 mg) allow your doctor to make dose adjustments based on your tolerance
- If you need to reduce your dose due to tolerability, Verzenio is approved to be dosed as low as 50 mg twice daily, as directed by your doctor
- No matter what dose you are prescribed, you will take 1 tablet, 2 times a day, unless your doctor tells you otherwise

What should I do if I miss a dose or get sick after taking a dose?

- If you miss a dose of Verzenio or get sick after taking a dose, take your next dose at your regular time.

 Do not take an extra dose of Verzenio to make up for any dose you may have missed
- For example, if you forget to take your morning dose, then you should only take your regular evening dose rather than doubling it



If you take more Verzenio than was prescribed, call your doctor or go to the nearest hospital emergency room right away

How should I take Verzenio?

- · Swallow the prescribed number of Verzenio tablets whole. Do not chew, crush, or split before swallowing
- You can take Verzenio with or without food
- Avoid grapefruit and grapefruit products while taking Verzenio. Grapefruit may increase the amount of Verzenio in your blood

Can I take other medicines with Verzenio?

- Verzenio and certain other medicines can affect each other, causing serious side effects or changing the effect of Verzenio or other medications
- Before starting any medication, make sure you talk to your doctor about all your other medications. Some examples include prescription and over-the-counter medicines, vitamins, and herbal supplements. Your doctor may need to change your dose

Verzenio +

an aromatase inhibitor (AI)

Explore the effectiveness and side effects of Verzenio + an Al.

Verzenio was studied in combination with an AI as initial endocrine-based therapy in 493 postmenopausal women with newly diagnosed, hormone receptor positive (HR+), human epidermal growth factor receptor 2 negative (HER2–) advanced or metastatic breast cancer. In the study, 328 patients were treated with Verzenio + an AI and 165 were treated with an AI alone.



LIVE LONGER WITHOUT CANCER GETTING WORSE

Verzenio + an AI delayed disease progression for over 2 years (a median of 28.2 months) vs 14.8 months with an AI alone



More than half of the women saw their tumors shrink

In a clinical study, 55.4% of women on Verzenio + an Al saw their tumors shrink vs 40.2% on an Al alone.

COMPLETE RESPONSE:

NO DETECTABLE SIGNS OF CANCER

3.4% of women on Verzenio + an Al had a complete response vs 0% with an Al alone.

PARTIAL RESPONSE:

TUMOR SHRINKAGE OF 30% OR MORE

52.1% of women on Verzenio + an Al had a partial response vs 40.2% with an Al alone.

Clinical trials are still ongoing to determine if there is an overall survival benefit.



Verzenio + fulvestrant

Explore the effectiveness and side effects of Verzenio + fulvestrant.

Verzenio was studied in a clinical trial of 669 women with hormone receptor positive (HR+), human epidermal growth factor receptor 2 negative (HER2–) metastatic breast cancer, whose disease had progressed after hormone treatment: 446 patients were treated with Verzenio + fulvestrant, and 223 were treated with fulvestrant alone.



WOMEN LIVED LONGER ON VERZENIO + FULVESTRANT

In the clinical study, women taking Verzenio + fulvestrant lived for a median of 46.7 months vs 37.3 months on fulvestrant alone



MORE TIME WITHOUT DISEASE PROGRESSION

In the same study, Verzenio + fulvestrant delayed disease progression for a median of 16.4 months vs 9.3 months with fulvestrant alone



TWICE AS MANY WOMEN SAW THEIR TUMORS SHRINK

48.1% of patients on Verzenio + fulvestrant saw their tumors shrink vs 21.3% with fulvestrant alone

COMPLETE RESPONSE:

NO DETECTABLE SIGNS OF CANCER

In a clinical study, 3.5% of women on Verzenio + fulvestrant had a complete response vs 0% with fulvestrant alone.

PARTIAL RESPONSE:

TUMOR SHRINKAGE OF 30% OR MORE

In the same study, 44.7% of women on Verzenio + fulvestrant had a partial response vs 21.3% with fulvestrant alone.



Verzenio by itself

Explore the effectiveness and side effects of Verzenio by itself.

Verzenio was studied in 132 adult patients with hormone receptor positive (HR+), human epidermal growth factor receptor 2 negative (HER2-) advanced or metastatic breast cancer who had progressed on or after prior hormone treatments, a taxane, and 1 or 2 chemotherapy regimens in the metastatic setting. All patients were treated with only Verzenio.

VERZENIO SHRINKS TUMORS AND DELAYS THE SPREAD OF CANCER

When other advanced or metastatic breast cancer treatments (hormonal treatments and prior chemotherapy) stopped working, Verzenio helped delay the growth and spread of cancer in a clinical study.

TUMOR 30% or more

SHRINKAGE OF 19.7% of women taking Verzenio alone saw their tumors shrink by 30% or more. In the same study, an independent review found similar results (17.4% of women)



Addressing diarrhea

The first step to managing side effects is to know what to expect.

Diarrhea is one of the most common side effects with Verzenio. Read on to learn more about how to **EXPECT**, **PLAN**, and **ACT** if you experience diarrhea while taking Verzenio.

Diarrhea can be managed with the appropriate steps, so EXPECT, PLAN, and ACT.

EXPECT: DIARRHEA IS A COMMON SIDE EFFECT

Diarrhea is a common side effect with Verzenio and may sometimes be severe, but you and your doctor can take steps to manage it. If diarrhea occurs, it will most likely happen in the first week. You should be on the lookout for cramping or frequent, loose, or watery stools.

PLAN: PLAN AHEAD OF TIME

It is important to plan ahead of time with your doctor. Make sure you have an over-the-counter anti-diarrheal medicine, such as loperamide (also known as Imodium®), available at home before you start taking Verzenio.

ACT: IMMEDIATE 24-HOUR ACTION PLAN

If you begin experiencing diarrhea, it is very important that you take action immediately at the first signs of symptoms. The best way to manage diarrhea is to start an antidiarrheal at the first sign and call your doctor, who may make a dose change.

Immediate 24-hour action plan



STEP 1: Start an antidiarrheal and call your doctor

If you are experiencing diarrhea, you need to start taking an antidiarrheal as directed on the packaging and call your doctor or nurse immediately so they are aware and can help you manage the diarrhea.



STEP 2: Stay hydrated and drink clear fluids

Drink at least 8-12 glasses of clear fluids in the first 24 hours you experience symptoms (and continue any day you experience diarrhea) to avoid dehydration.



STEP 3: Watch for improvement and follow up with your doctor

Ideally, the antidiarrheal will be able to help resolve your symptoms, but if symptoms continue after the first 24 hours, you need to talk to your doctor or nurse that day. He or she may consider adjusting your dose, with the ultimate goal of finding which dose is right for you. Verzenio is effective at different doses, so it is important to find what dose is right for your body.



ADDITIONAL MONITORING MONITORING BLOOD COUNTS AND LIVER FUNCTION

Some patients experienced low white blood cell counts (neutropenia) and/or liver problems. Your doctor will do blood tests to monitor your blood cell counts and to check for liver problems before and during treatment.

- Take Verzenio exactly as your healthcare provider tells you.
- Your healthcare provider may change your dose if needed. Do not stop taking Verzenio or change the dose without talking to your healthcare provider.
- Verzenio may be taken with or without food.

- If you are pregnant, plan to become pregnant, or are breastfeeding.
- About all the medicines you take, including prescription and over-the-counter medicines, vitamins, and herbal supplements. Especially tell your healthcare provider if you take a medicine that contains ketoconazole.
- Swallow Verzenio tablets whole. Do not chew, crush, or split the tablets before swallowing. Do not take Verzenio tablets if they are broken, cracked, or damaged.
- Take your doses of Verzenio at about the same time every day.
- If you vomit or miss a dose of Verzenio, take your next dose at your regular time. Do not take 2 doses at the same time to make up for the missed dose.

What to avoid during treatment

- Avoid taking ketoconazole during treatment with Verzenio. Tell your healthcare provider if you take a medicine that contains ketoconazole
- Avoid grapefruit and products that contain grapefruit during treatment with Verzenio. Grapefruit may increase the amount of Verzenio in your blood
